MoSPI

MoSPI is an executive ministry of the Government of India concerned with coverage and quality aspects of statistics released in the country. The surveys conducted by the Ministry are based on scientific sampling methods, and field data are collected through dedicated field staff. It compiles and releases the Index of Industrial Production (IIP) every month, conducts the Annual Survey of Industries (ASI), and organises periodic all-India Economic Censuses and enterprise surveys.

CORE

CORE is the world's largest collection of open access research papers, hosting a comprehensive bibliographic database of the world's scholarly literature. It is a not-for-profit, community-governed open scholarly infrastructure serving the global network of repositories and journals. CORE allows users to search 284 million papers from around the world, providing both metadata and full-text access through its APIs and datasets — making it one of the most powerful free research databases available.

Taylor & Francis Expands Diamond Open Access Model with Six New Journals

Taylor & Francis has expanded its Collective Pathway to Open Publishing (CPOP), a diamond open access model, adding six new journals for 2026 through partnerships with Jisc in the UK and CAUL in Australasia. The newly converted titles include Australian Archaeology, Contemporary British History, Critical Studies in Education, Journal of the Australian Library and Information Association, King's Law Journal, and Studies in Theatre & Performance.

CPOP enables researchers to publish open access without paying article publishing charges by combining funding from OA agreements, institutional subscriptions, and read-access fees. Designed specifically for Humanities and Social Sciences, the model also covers specialist content such as book reviews and practitioner articles typically excluded from standard OA agreements.
